St. Timothy's Choir welcomes older teen and adult singers and is responsible for leading music at the 10:30 liturgy, festival liturgies, and combined services. The Choir rehearses on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. for 90 minutes, September through May

Throughout the year, St. Timothy's Choir participates in special services at the church and joins forces with other singers in the community. In past years, we have sung in joint Evensongs, community-wide hymn festivals, and cooperative services with other churches.

St. Timothy's Schola

The Schola is St. Timothy's youth singing and advanced ringing choir, whose membership includes ages 13+, grades 8+ and meets Sundays in the Choir Room and Nave, 1:30-2:30 p.m., or as fits the schedule of active teens! Flexibility is the key with this group, including those who just ring and those who just sing.

The Schola rehearses each week (except during school breaks and high holy days). They sing/ring as prepared at the 10:30 service. They may also participate in the choral events with St. Timothy's Choristers, with the adult choir on Christmas Eve, and in the Chattanooga-area adult and chorister Evensongs.

Schola's repertoire includes classical and world music, serious and fun. Royal School of Church Music (RSCM) opportunities—including the Nashville Chorister Festival and summer RSCM Charlotte (NC) course—are provided for this choir as well. Membership is open to younger boys with changed voices; please inquire. We also practice small ensemble handbell ringing (duets to quartets). Philip Newton is the director.

St. Timothy's Handbell Choir welcomes older teens and adults. The Choir rehearses Wednesdays, 6:00-7:00 p.m., in the Nave, September through May. The choir plays at about one service every six weeks.
